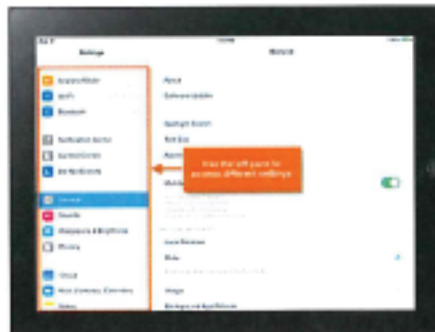

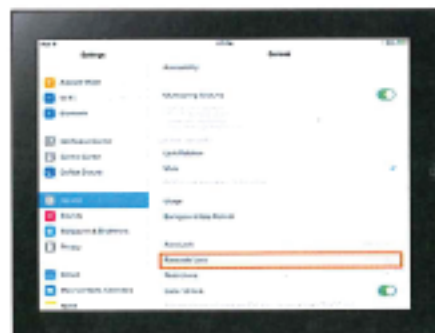
Once you're more familiar with the iPad, you may want to take some times to review and customize your devices settings. Settings control everything from the way your iPad works to the date it shares with apps and other devices. You can open Settings by tapping the icon on your Home Screen

As you can see below, Settings gives you easy access to many different things, including settings for your apps, email accounts, and iCloud. To view or edit you options, tap an item in the left pane. Within the Settings app today we will focus on General settings and Privacy settings.

Under General, you can customize many different settings that control your iPad's security, accessibility, and overall preferences. By default, the iPad doesn't require a passcode to unlock it. However, you can set one to help protect your device. Requiring a passcode will make it considerably more difficult for someone else to access your iPad if its lost or stolen. 1. Tap General in the left pane. The on the right tape Passcode Lock to view your options.
